5 questions put to Laurent Dantan, General Manager of Caderas Martin

You announced plans to establish a regional presence with an initial office opening in Nice. How many other offices is the company looking to open and within which timeframe?

Opening an office in Nice is only the first step. On the strength of this experience, we shall consider setting up offices in other regions. We will only proceed if we know that we can rely on a trusted colleague who is prepared to take on the role of Head of the Nice office and who shares the values of our firm. We are very pleased to be able to rely on Vincent Pastur for our first opening.



What criteria do you apply when selecting a location?

We will not necessarily be targeting very large cities, although Nice is the 5th largest, but rather we will take into account the network we have in place locally and naturally the quality of the economic fabric.



Does this mean your clients will have to change their contact persons and/or reference office on the basis of their geographical location ?

No, of course not ! Working with collaborative tools has enabled us to significantly improve our organisation. On the other hand, we do not rule out the possibility of specialising our regional offices in a given activity and/or sector.



You mentioned that your intention is to base your IT Department at this new location. Will this mean that only employees working in this department will be present in the new office?

Vincent assumes this position with the dual role of Senior Manager in charge of the IT Department and Head of the Nice office. However, not all the staff in this department will be located in Nice.

We will make it easier for them to move from one location to another in order to remain effective in the mission entrusted to them. Vincent will manage the planning, organisation, and follow-up of the IT missions from the Nice office.



Just a few words now about Vincent Pastur and the IT Department?

We are delighted to have Vincent back on board. He already worked for the firm between January 2007 and October 2011, starting as a trainee and ending up as a project manager.

Extremely passionate about the contribution of artificial intelligence to the accounting and auditing professions, he was a driving force within our firm in identifying these techniques.
